WORKING WITH INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

On Australian Shores, Survivor Stories (2019-2023)

Dr Alexander Hayes and myself, through our partnership Ngikalikarra Media, conducted personal interviews, produced, and edited a 54-minute documentary film over a three-year period, listening to those directly and indirectly affected by the Agriculture Protection Board (APB) herbicide spraying programs across the East Kimberley and West Kimberley region of Western Australia in the 1970s and 1980s. The film has been featured on SBS/NITV and SBS On Demand from February 2023 onwards, and was sponsored by the McCumstie and McCasker families, the Martuwarra Fitzroy River Council, the Ngalla Maya Corporation, the First Nations Homelessness Project, and the Institute of Social Justice and Human Rights.

Martuwarra Fitzroy River Council (2018-2023)

Since the establishment of the Martuwarra Fitzroy River Council (MFRC) in 2018, I have worked on a number of collaborative projects as a researcher and filmmaker with the Council.

In 2020, I directed and filmed *Voices for the Martuwarra*, a collaborative documentary featuring interviews with members of the MFRC, scientists, environmentalists, and researchers. Through breathtaking visuals of the Martuwarra, Fitzroy River, and engaging interviews with multiple stakeholders, the film traces the creation of the MFRC, which was established in 2018 to give a political voice to Traditional Owners of the Fitzroy River Region amidst extensive development plans earmarked for the Kimberley in the mining and agricultural sectors. Since its inception the MFRC has attracted the attention of leading scientists and researchers, both in Australia and internationally, through its ability to bring together the majority of Traditional Owner groups from the region, and spearheading collaborative, cutting-edge research into various domains: First Law, culture, science, history, economy and development.

In 2021, I co-wrote a report, *Martuwarra Country: A Historical Perspective (1838-Present)*, published by the Nulungu Research Institute (University of Notre Dame, Broome).

Since May 2022, I have also been working on an archival project for the setting up of the Nyikina Cultural Database, and have presented papers and films with Professor Anne Poelina, Chair of the MFRC, at various conferences and seminars.

Nyoongar People, Perth (2018-2020)

In July 2018 I moved to Perth and I had the opportunity, through our media production company (Ngikalikarra Media), to work with Indigenous organisations such as Wadjak Northside and Ngalla Maya to produce short films designed to showcase their work within the Nyoongar community (Ngalla Maya Aboriginal Corporation: Suicide: Your Pain is Now Your Family's Heartache, 2018). I also collaborated closely with the Institute for Social Justice and Human Rights, and the National Critical Indigenous Response Service, to produce an awareness-raising film about homelessness in Perth (2018), and to support survivors of child sexual abuses telling their stories (Let Them Speak, 2019).

As part of my role as Film Department Coordinator at SAE, I facilitated partnerships with multiple local Aboriginal community organisations and the United Nations Association of Western Australia for our students to gain experience in working in cross-cultural contexts on real-world projects. For this, I received the **SAE Australasia Engagement Award** in 2019.

PAKAM - Pilbara and Kimberley Aboriginal Media (2017-2018)

From May 2017 to July 2018 I had the privilege to be employed full-time by PAKAM (Pilbara and Kimberley Aboriginal Media), in Broome, as a Community Media Trainer, whilst completing my PhD. My role consisted in going out to remote Aboriginal communities and training, or upskilling, new PAKAM employees and current staff, so they were able to make their own films about the issues that mattered to them in their own communities. I had the opportunity to travel and work in the communities of Bidyadanga, Beagle Bay, Djarindjin, Ardyaloon, Warmun, Jigalong, Looma, Balgo, Mulan, Ngumpan, Kalumburu, and Billiluna. I have also been working with the Nyikina Community to document the development of the Nyikina-Mangala Nation towards economic sustainability, and the Native Title Process. In this context, I undertook further studies with the University of Western Australia and completed their *Graduate Certificate in Native Title and Cultural Heritage* at the end of 2009.

In May 2012 I presented a paper at the *Narrative Matters* Conference in Paris entitled *Filmed Narratives: Lived Experience and Social Change in Aboriginal Australia*. I then facilitated a series of conferences in France for my Nyikina Cultural Mentor, Dr. Anne Poelina, and Madjulla Inc. Director of Operations, Ian Perdrisat, at the UNESCO Human Rights Commission (Extraordinary Session), the Metz Regional Funds for Contemporary Arts, the University of Nancy II, and the Vienne Institute of Technology.

I was also asked to do the French subtitle adaptation of *Heritage Fight* (2012), a documentary by French filmmaker Eugénie Dumont. I was engaged by the producers on the basis of my knowledge and relationship with the local people who feature in the film.

Trois Soeurs, Femmes de la Mardoowarra (Three Sisters, Women of High Degree): In May 2014 I had the privilege to go to France with Dr. Anne Poelina to present our documentary (46 min), Trois Soeurs, which was part of the Official Selection for the International Pacific Film Festival of Rochefort, France. The film has since been screened at the International Islander Film Festival of Groix, France (August 2014), the International Douarnenez Film Festival (France, August 2015), in the Paris Festival du Rêve de l'Aborigène (July 2016), and the Festi-Vache Festival in Lyon (France, April 2017).

Its Australian version, *Three Sisters, Women of High Degree* (2015) was screened on the SBS / NITV (National Indigenous Television Network), from 2015 to 2018, the *Reading the Country Festival* (Melbourne, October 2014), and was part of the Official Selection of the 11th *Native Spirit International Film Festival* (London, October 2016). It is now screening on ICTV (Indigenous Community Television) and the international *Films for Action* platform.

Anne Poelina: Yimardoowarra Marnin - short film produced for Dr. Anne Poelina's presentation at the TransOceanik Conference in Cairns, James Cook University, July 2014.

Duchess is Paradise: a short film produced for Madjulla Inc. as a community submission to the Environment Protection Agency about the importance of country around the area where a coal mine is planned.

Gulbujargu Personal Development Program: a 7-minute short film made with young people from Derby about the Gulbujargu Personal Development program. To be used by Gulbujargu Inc, for funding applications.

Mapping and Protecting our Sacred Sites: a 15-minute short film made with Nyikina women about mapping their country and sacred sites, in collaboration with the Auckland University of Technology and two scientists, Dr. Barbara Bollard Breen, and Dr. John Robertson. To be used by Madjulla Inc. for funding applications.

Indigenous River Voices: Reading Our Kandri: a 20-minute short film featuring Nyikina women telling the stories of the Mardoowarra, Fitzroy River, of its creation, and its continued importance to the women's everyday lives. Includes the voices of Elders past and present, for presentation at the Reading the Country Conference, University of Melbourne, October 2014.

Our Shared and Common Future: a 10-minute short film produced for Anne Poelina's keynote address at the World Climate Change Conference in Paris in July 2015 (Our Common Future Under Climate Change).

Our Community, Our Story (September 2016): a collaborative film with the community of Pandanus Park, on Nyikina Country, to attract the government's attention on the issues faced by the community regarding the removal of essential services and bore water contamination, while the community is trying to stay positive and looking towards the future, setting up educational and training programs. This film was launched during the visit to Broome of the UN Rapporteur on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in March 2017.

Mardoowarra's Right to Life (March 2017): a short film highlighting the need to listen to the voice of the Mardoowarra, Fitzroy River, in the context of development. This film was launched at the International Tribunal on the Rights of Nature in Brisbane (October 2016) for the Mardoowarra/Fitzroy River versus State and Federal Governments case, and screened for the visit in Broome of the UN Rapporteur on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in March 2017.

2016-2017: Adnyamanthanha People: Protecting Country

In 2016, my partner Alexander Hayes and myself, through our media production company, Ngikalikarra Media, had the opportunity to travel to the Flinders Ranges of South Australia at the invitation of Bruce Hammond, a Tanganekald man from Adelaide. We travelled the region for a few weeks filming extensively with a number of Aboriginal communities, particularly Adnyamathanha people, who wanted to make their voices heard about a proposed Federal nuclear waste dump on their country. Our collaborative and emancipatory principles meant that we went back to screen the first cut of the documentary to the communities throughout the region before publishing the final film. The film was part of Official Selection of the 13th Edition of the *International Native Spirit Festival* in London (October 2019), the *International Uranium Film Festival* (Berlin & Rio de Janeiro, 2020), the *Global Extraction Film Festival* (Jamaica, 2020) and the *Quetzalcoatl Indigenous International Film Festival* (2021). It is also now featured on the *Films for Action* platform.

2013-2014: Environment and Sustainable Development Directorate (ESDD) ACT Government

I was engaged as a consultant through ANUedge, in collaboration with the National Centre for Indigenous Studies, to work with the Environment and Sustainable Development Directorate, ACT Government, and ACT Parks, to carry out an evaluation of their 2011-2013 programme in Aboriginal Land and Natural Resource Management (Yurung Dhaura Team). I was the principal author of a comprehensive report on the program, and directed two films highlighting the project's implementation, the trainees' expectations and feedback about the program, as well as their employment outcomes. The film produced can be viewed here: *The Yurung Dhaura Project*

2004 – 2015: Tweed & Gold Coast Communities

In 2004 I was approached by the Tweed Heads Aboriginal Community to document their fight against the now-infamous Tugun Bypass, a 4-lane highway straddling the border between New South Wales and Queensland, south of the Gold Coast. I worked with the community for a year to document not only their political and environmental fight, but also their knowledge of a vital Aboriginal cultural landscape known by the local traditional owners, "Murrabah", an important meeting ground for all the Aboriginal people of the wider area. *Bypassed: The Erosion of our Cultural and Environmental Landscapes* was the resulting documentary, which was screened at various film nights regionally and sent to all major Aboriginal, government and non-government organisations in Australia. The main issue at stake was the refusal of various levels of governments to collaborate in a meaningful way with local custodians, and the widespread reticence to acknowledge the existence of Aboriginal cultural "landscapes", as opposed to isolated "sites", symptomatic of most archaeological surveys conducted at that time in the context of major developments.

Documenting the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Program for the Tweed Shire City of the Arts 2003-2005, an initiative of the NSW Ministry for the Arts.

Nature of the work: statefunded The project included:

- Filming launches, festivals, exhibitions, workshops and meetings
- Production of a promotional DVD for the Aboriginal Dance Troupe "Ginibi"
- Production of a DVD for the Homegrown Filmworks Project
- Mentorship of 6 new filmmakers for more than a year
- Production of a DVD on the whole of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Program
- Assisting with the organisation and transcription of stories for the Gunngah Binnung "Listen Up" Exhibition, an exhibition on stories of the Tweed Aboriginal Community.

Corporate DVD: "Let Your GP Know: Be Proud, Think Health", 2006

Nature of the work: state-funded

I was approached by the Chairman of the Tweed Byron Local Aboriginal Land Council to assist in the production of a DVD dealing with Indigenous Health Issues, funded by the Department of Health and Ageing, Indigenous Health. I was the cameraperson and editor for this short film, which is to be screened at NAIDOC week events and throughout NSW doctors' surgeries.

Krurungal Aboriginal Corporation - 2010

Nature of the work: state-funded

In this project I was employed as a cameraperson to film Bundjalung women's workshops on the Gold Coast, and record interviews with numerous community Elders. These interviews and workshops feature in a short documentary entitled "Gangalah Jarjums" – "to listen to understand".

O'Connor Boathouse All-Black Dances - 2012

Griffith University, Indigenous Research Centre

Interviewing Community Elders about the renowned Aboriginal Dances at the O'Connor Boathouse in Brisbane in the 1950s and 1960s for a future stage play.

Serving Our Country Project, ANU, April 2015

I assisted the ANU team from the Serving Our Country Project in facilitating a Community Yarn Up in the Tweed region, and filmed some of the interviews. I also produced a film of the *Defending Country Conference*, organised by the National Centre for Indigenous Studies.

2007-2008: Indigenous Community Volunteers, Canberra

Aside from volunteering for ICV in 2007 and 2008, Indigenous Community Volunteers also used my services to direct and produce 3 corporate short films as well as their National Community Service Announcements Campaign, and film their National Conference in 2008 (1000 Projects, 1000 Volunteers). In working with ICV I have had the privilege to travel to Aboriginal Communities throughout Australia.
