WORKING WITH INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

Nyoongar People, Perth (2018-2020)

Since moving to Perth in 2018 I have had the opportunity to work with Indigenous organisations such as Wadjak Northside and Ngalla Maya to produce short films designed to showcase their work within the Nyoongar community (Ngalla Maya Aboriginal Corporation, *Suicide: Your Pain is Now Your Family's Heartache*, 2018). I also collaborated closely with the Institute for Social Justice and Human Rights, and the National Critical Indigenous Response Service, to produce an awareness-raising film about homelessness in Perth (2018), and to support survivors of child sexual abuses telling their stories (*Let Them Speak*, 2019).

As part of my role as Film Department Coordinator at SAE, I have facilitated partnerships with multiple local Aboriginal community organisations and the United Nations Association of Western Australia for our students to gain experience in working in cross-cultural contexts on real-world projects. For this, I received the **SAE Australasia Engagement Award** in 2019.

PAKAM - Pilbara and Kimberley Aboriginal Media (2017-2020)

From May 2017 to July 2018 I had the privilege to be employed full-time by PAKAM (Pilbara and Kimberley Aboriginal Media), in Broome, as a Community Media Trainer, whilst completing my PhD. My role consisted in going out to remote Aboriginal communities and train, or upskill, new PAKAM employees and current staff, so they were able to make their own films about the issues that mattered to them in their own communities. I had the opportunity to travel and work in the communities of Bidyadanga, Beagle Bay, Djarindjin, Ardyaloon, Warmun, Jigalong, Looma, Balgo, Mulan, Ngumpan, Kalumburu, and Bililuna. I started working in my capacity as a professional filmmaker with Nyikina women in 2007, and we have since produced many collaborative films:

The Nyikina Cultural Centre (2007, corporate)
The Majala Wilderness Centre (2008, corporate)
Mardoowarra, River of Life (2008, short film)
Robert Watson (2008, documentary)
Pandanus Park Community (2007, corporate)

A documentary was also produced with / for the Jarlmadangah Burru Community: *Jarlmadangah Burru, Celebrating 20 years of Achievements* (2007, documentary)

A promotional film for Oongkalkada Wilderness Camp, Aboriginal Adventures, *Seize The Moment*, was completed in January 2009.

In 2009-2010, I filmed three more films with Madjulla Inc., *Building A Nation: The Nyikina-Mangala Way*, *The Nyikina Language Hub*, and *Reclaiming the Mardoowarra: River of Life* for the National Native Title Conference in Canberra in 2010.

At the time I was also working with the Nyikina Community to document the development of the Nyikina-Mangala Nation towards economic sustainability, and the Native Title Process. In this context, I undertook further studies with the University of Western Australia and completed their *Graduate Certificate in Native Title and Cultural Heritage* at the end of 2009.

In May 2012 I had the privilege to be selected to present a paper at the *Narrative Matters* Conference in Paris entitled *"Filmed Narratives: Lived Experience and Social Change in Aboriginal Australia"*. I then facilitated a series of conferences in France for my Nyikina Cultural Mentor, Dr. Anne Poelina, and Madjulla Inc. Director of Operations, Ian Perdrisat, at the UNESCO Human Rights Commission (Extraordinary Session), the Metz Regional Funds for Contemporary Arts, the University of Nancy II, and the Vienne Institute of Technology.

I was also asked to do the **French subtitle adaptation** of *Heritage Fight* (2012), a documentary by French filmmaker Eugénie Dumont. I was engaged by the producers on the basis of my knowledge and relationship with the local people who feature in the film.

Trois Soeurs, Femmes de la Mardoowarra (Three Sisters, Women of High Degree): In May 2014 I had the privilege to go to France with Dr. Anne Poelina to present our documentary (46 min), Trois Soeurs, which was part of the Official Selection for the International Pacific Film Festival of Rochefort, France. The film was screened at the International Islander Film Festival of Groix, France (August 2014), the International Douarnenez Film Festival (France, August 2015), in the Paris Festival du Rêve de l'Aborigène (July 2016), and the Festi-Vache Festival in Lyon (France, April 2017).

Its Australian version, *Three Sisters, Women of High Degree* (2015) was screened on the SBS / National Indigenous Television Network in Australia (NITV, 2015-2018), the *Reading the Country Festival* (Melbourne, October 2014), was part of the Official Selection of the 11th *Native Spirit International Film Festival* (London, October 2016), and of the Carbon8 Campfire Film Festival (December 2020). It is still being screened on ICTV.

Duchess is Paradise: a short film produced for Madjulla Inc. as a community submission to the Environment Protection Agency about the importance of country around the area where a coal mine is planned.

Gulbujargu Personal Development Program: a 7-minute short film made with young people from Derby about the Gulbujargu Personal Development program, to be used by Gulbujargu Inc, for funding applications.

Mapping and Protecting our Sacred Sites: a 15-minute short film made with Nyikina women about mapping their country and sacred sites, in collaboration with the Auckland University of Technology and two scientists, Dr. Barbara Bollard Breen, and Dr. John Robertson.

Indigenous River Voices: Reading Our Kandri: a 20-minute short film featuring Nyikina women telling the stories of the Mardoowarra, Fitzroy River, of its creation, and its continued importance to the women's everyday lives. Includes the voices of Elders past and present, for presentation at the Reading the Country Conference, University of Melbourne, October 2014.

Our Shared and Common Future: a 10-minute short film produced for Anne Poelina's keynote address at the World Climate Change Conference in Paris in July 2015 (Our Common Future Under Climate Change)

Our Community, Our Story (September 2016): a collaborative film with the community of Pandanus Park, on Nyikina Country, to attract the government's attention on the issues faced by the community regarding the removal of essential services and bore water contamination, while the community is trying to stay positive and looking towards the future, setting up educational and training programs. This film was launched during the visit to Broome of the UN Rapporteur on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in March 2017.

Mardoowarra's Right to Life (March 2017): a short film highlighting the need to listen to the voice of the Mardoowarra, Fitzroy River, in the context of development. This film was launched at the International Tribunal on the Rights of Nature in Brisbane (October 2016) for the Mardoowarra/Fitzroy River versus State and Federal Governments case, and screened for the visit in Broome of the UN Rapporteur on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in March 2017.

Bookarrarra Liyan Mardoowarra Booroo (August 2019): Featuring Dr Anne Poelina and Jeannie Warbie, talking about the protection of the Fitzroy River (Mardoowarra) for future generations of the world (Inaugural Winner, United Nations Association of Western Australia Short Film Competition).

I have continued to work with Nyikina people and many other Kimberley communities as part of the Martuwarra Fitzroy River Council's campaign to protect the Fitzroy River (*Voices for the Martuwarra*, 2020)

2016-2017: Adnyamanthanha People: *Protecting Country*

In 2016, my partner Alexander Hayes and myself, through our media production company, Ngikalikarra Media, had the opportunity to travel to the Flinders Ranges of South Australia at the invitation of Bruce Hammond, a Tanganekald man from Adelaide. We travelled the region for a few weeks filming extensively with a number of Aboriginal communities, particularly Adnyamathanha people, who wanted to make their voices heard about a proposed Federal nuclear waste dump on their country. Our collaborative and emancipatory principles meant that we went back to screen the first cut of the documentary to the communities throughout the region before publishing the final film, *Protecting Country*. The film was part of Official Selection of the 13th Edition of the International Native Spirit Festival in London (October 2019), the International Uranium Film Festival (Rio De Janeiro, 2020), the Global Extraction Film Festival (2020), and was selected for screening on the Films for Action platform (2018).

2013-2014: Environment and Sustainable Development Directorate (ESDD) ACT Government

I was engaged as a consultant through ANUedge, in collaboration with the National Centre for Indigenous Studies, to work with the Environment and Sustainable Development Directorate, ACT Government, and ACT Parks, to carry out an evaluation of their 2011-2013 programme in Aboriginal Land and Natural Resource Management (Yurung Dhaura Team). I was the principal author of a comprehensive report on the program, and directed two films highlighting the project's implementation, the trainees' expectations and feedback about the program, as well as their employment outcomes.

2004 – 2015: Tweed & Gold Coast Communities

In 2004 I was approached by the Tweed Heads Aboriginal Community to document their fight against the now-infamous Tugun Bypass, a 4-lane highway straddling the border between New South Wales and Queensland, south of the Gold Coast. I worked with the community for a year to document not only their political and environmental fight, but also their knowledge of a vital Aboriginal cultural landscape known by the local traditional owners, "Murrabah", an important meeting ground for all the Aboriginal people of the wider area. "Bypassed: The Erosion of our Cultural and Environmental Landscapes" was the resulting documentary, which was screened at various film nights regionally and sent to all major Aboriginal, government and non-government organisations in Australia. The main issue at stake was the refusal of various levels of governments to collaborate in a meaningful way with local custodians, and the widespread reticence to acknowledge the existence of Aboriginal cultural "landscapes", as opposed to isolated "sites", symptomatic of most archaeological surveys conducted at that time in the context of major developments.
